Training for Life

The Path: “1, 2, 3, EDC”

The Path process was developed to give students a clear and digestible process to becoming proficient with their firearms. A common problem people have with learning pistols is they either get no meaningful training or they learn the absolute basics (how to load) and not much more.

In Pistol 1 (Beginner), we review the major safety rules and why they are important to follow. Students learn about their specific handgun, how to field strip, clean, and maintain it, as well as how to shoot at close range. The class covers how to read target results and drills to increase accuracy.

Pistol 2 (Intermediate) is an outdoor class when holsterwork and speed are introduced. These new elements come with additional safety procedures and common courtesies on a range. Students are exposed to more difficult drills including how to perform magazine reloads quickly and shoot at greater distances with precision.

Pistol 3 (Advanced) adds student movement into the curriculum. Decision making and reload choices become important. The course of fire involves different shooting locations at multiple targets.

EDC is the culmination of Pistol 1, 2, and 3. The acronym means Every Day Carry - what do you carry everyday and is it working for you. This class tests our setups through a very challenging course of fire including different shooting positions, locations, and various targets. Does your gear work for you, or are you working for your gear? Find out with EDC.

Specialty Classes

Red-Dot (Intermediate - Advanced)

Pistol mounted optics are here to stay and this class helps beginner to advanced shooters acquire the skills and knowledge they need to make the transition from iron sights.

Low Light (Intermediate - Advanced)

The operation of a handgun is harder than rifles or shotguns because it is not braced in the shoulder. Adding the complexity of a light meaning some habits will need to change from the usual shooting in the daytime. Learn when and how to use flashlights, and when and how not to.

Carbine 1 (Beginner - Intermediate)

Carbine 2 (Intermediate - Advanced)

AR15 style rifles or carbines have a new level of complexity from those in our pistol courses. The beginner course of Carbine 1, includes operation of the moving parts, field stripping, cleaning, and maintenance, and basic marksmanship. Carbine 2 challenges the student in various drills to test transitions and reloads, as well as things like types of slings, malfunction clearing.

LABS: Learn & Build Skills (Beginner to Advanced)

Twice a month group pistol class to sharpen skills. Progress cards are kept so students can track improvement and see what they need to practice. Get in the reps and make progress fast! Packages available for 12 and 24 LABS.
